Formed in 1889, its prestigious members have included U.S. Grant, Lowell Thomas, Norman Vincent Peale, Nelson and Winthrop Rockefeller as well as senators, governors and generals.

Roger traces his lineage back to the 1640's when his forebears arrived from England. His ancestor Thomas Welles was the third governor of the colony of Connecticut. Another, Elisha Wolcott of Wethersfield, fought in the Battle of New York and the Rev. Peter Bulkeley was the first minister and founder of the colony of Concord, Massachusetts.
