

#### **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

**Connecticut allows** you to receive an absentee ballot if you cannot appear at your polling place on Election Day for reasons such as physical disability, absence from town or sickness. Sickness may be your own or that of someone you care for. Visit the Town Clerk to receive your absentee ballot. All absentee ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk or the Absentee Ballot drop box by 8 p.m. on Election Day, Nov. 8.



### The New (OTC) Hearing Aids: What You Need to Know

High-quality hearing aids are now available over the counter. According to one expert, more than 90% of adults with hearing loss can benefit from these new devices. Hearing aids will be available at pharmacies and big-box stores such as Best Buy. Important points to remember:

- Finding the right device and adjusting it to the correct "acoustic fit" may take several tries.
- Return policies must be clearly specified on the package. Because it may take several weeks to adapt to amplified sound, look for at least a 30-day policy.
- Some users will have no problem self-fitting their new devices with online tools. Others will need guidance on choosing, fitting and learning to live with the new aids.
- It remains to be seen how audiologists will adjust to the new environment. Some may alter their practices to provide testing, education, counseling and support. Others may not.
- Check out the tip sheet from the Hearing Loss Association of America. The Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health created HearingNumber.org to help people assess their level of hearing loss and learn about treatment options. (This requires an Apple smartphone or tablet.)

**Relief is on the way!** The Social Security Administration recently announced the largest cost-of-living adjustment in more than 40 years raising benefits 8.7% beginning in 2023 to help keep pace with inflation. AVOID SCAMS: Do not answer questions regarding your Social Security payments or personal information over the phone. There is no cost to you or any action you need to take. Remember: the IRS will NEVER call you!

### NEW Transportation Program is in Gear to Serve You:

**1. Book your ride** when you book your appointment, even if it is several weeks away.

2. Book multiple rides at the same time.

**3. Book rides** at least **48 hours** in advance as we cannot always find next day drivers.

4. Once a driver has called to confirm a ride, **please give them your cell phone number** and write down their number.

5. If you need to cancel a ride and a driver has already called you to confirm the ride, call THEIR cell phone to cancel. If you don't have their cell phone, call 203-762-2600. Always try the driver first.

**6. Have a special request**, like stopping at the pharmacy after your appointment? Let us know when you book the ride.
