Jordice Gigstad Browning, 102 years young, passed away August 7 at her residence in Kennebunk, Maine. Jordice joined SAHW in 2018 and remained a member until she moved to Maine in 2022. In Wilton, Jordice was active

in real estate and was a member of the Wilton Garden Club, St. Matthew's Church, the Wilton Historical Society, Wilton Library, and volunteered for Nursing Home Care among other organizations. SAHW member Pete Zareski remembers Jordice; "Our relationship with Jordice personifies everything SAHW is about. It started with a distress call to assist a 100 year old stranger with a washing machine problem in the basement of her very old farmhouse. We immediately bonded."

Gordon Nugent, 97, passed away August 18th. He had been an active member in SAHW since 2010 and was always a delightful presence at all the social events. Gordon settled in Wilton in 1959 and remained in the same house for over 64

years. Born and raised in Peoria, IL, he ventured to New York to pursue a career in Journalism after serving in the Navy during WWII. He worked at the New York Times then pivoted to public relations, working for GE and Union Carbide. In 2019, Gordon served as the Grand Marshal in Wilton's Memorial Day parade. He was a longtime member of The Kiwanis Club and his good friend and frequent SAHW driver Jerry Sprole says, "At age 97, he was truly an inspiration of positive thinking and amazing activity. I picture him with his two long hiking poles investigating the various byways in Heaven."

Wilton's Stay at Home group offers a village's worth of assistance to help seniors age in place



Seniors who might like to help others — or who might like to receive help — as part of a caring local community might want to consider joining Stay at Home. It's a local nonprofit network of Wilton neighbors who help older residents to remain living

independently in their own homes. With 120 members in town, the nonprofit Wilton "Village" is part of the national Village to Village Network, a nonprofit that offers guidance in setting up local groups. It began in 1999 and now has 250 groups across the country that help seniors "age in place."

"The core principle is to prolong the amount of time that seniors can stay in their home," said Peter Zareski, a member who, along with his wife, Lynne, hosted a monthly Coffee Club get-together for the Village at his Wilton home.
