Stay at Home members were treated to a very informative presentation by staff members of the new Humane Society facility scheduled to open in Wilton during August. This state-of-the-art facility will offer shelter services, fostering & adoption services, and veterinary care.

An outstanding feature of the new facility is an 18-acre area behind the

building that will encompass play yards, walking trails, and an agility course. Volunteers are welcomed as dog walkers, cat cuddlers, and animal care givers. Volunteers must have health insurance and make an initial commitment of six

You can explore the CT Humane Society's new Wilton Pet Resource Center during its open house on Friday or Saturday, August 29–30, from 12–2 pm.
